It's fair to say that our diocese is undergoing some big changes in the upcoming month. Our bishop is retiring, and our new bishop is being consecrated. Three members of the diocesan staff are also retiring. Lots of "last times" and "first times." Our new bishop, Sally Johnson French, is going to be amazing, the right person to lead us into our future. There will be lots of change across the breadth of the diocese, most of which will not impact us at the parish level. Which is good, because the things that will remain consistent are the ones that we want to continue to engage in. The primary movement that I'm thinking about is our Congregational Development Department, headed by Canon Rob Droste, and the ongoing initiatives like the Coaching Network and the Way of St. Paul.

Recently, we at St. David's hosted a day long event to kick of the fourth season of the Way of St. Paul (known lovingly as WoSP.) While preparing for the event, and in the weeks to follow, I slowly began to realize that this tool for growing wasn't very well known in our congregation. There were a few that had served on a WoSP team when we started the idea...nearly 8 years ago! Having been immersed in this way of aiding our growth since the start, I was like a fish trying to understand why everyone didn't know we were swimming in water! I would like to begin to introduce this style of growing together spiritually to everyone during our summer months so we can deepen our individual relationship with God, and our relationships with one another. To begin with, I'd like to share where the name of the movement comes from. The Way of St. Paul is strongly tied into Paul, who was the most well-travelled of the early leaders of the church. Over the course of about 14 years, he went throughout the ancient world, starting Christian communities and nurturing them. The early churches were communities of faithful people who came together to worship and to learn as disciples of Christ. Caring for each other and especially for those in need. As we are told in the Acts of the Apostles, "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer...all the believers were together and had everything in common. Every day they continued to meet in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

Spending time together, learning from Jesus's messages, all of this led to successful congregational growth. Paul met people where they were and talked to them in ways they understood. He would stay up all night or sit with people while they worked. He was willing to be with them whenever they could and help to encourage them to continue growing as individual disciples.

As we get to know more about Paul, we can see why his leadership style was such a great example for how we can continue to thrive as a parish. This summer, we will be offering a few opportunities to learn more about him and his traveling companion, Barnabas, along with some quick and easy ways to bring our relationships to the next level. The Rev. Dr. David Williams will be leading the sessions on the Becoming Barnabas, so look forward to the announcement of time soon. Until then, enjoy the transition of the diocese as we ramp up to our summer months!

## June Outreach

The Outreach donations go to RISE during the month of June. The motto on RISE's home page is "Your connection to learning, community and care" for Hightstown and surrounding communities. In addition to the wonderful services for fighting the war on poverty through their Food Pantry and

Thrift Shop, RISE offers programs for youth and teens. Summer enrichment camps are sponsored in partnership with EW Regional School District along with RISE's college readiness programs. Safe dating programs for teens for dating abuse prevention and Leadership Youth Conferences that stress and teach the steps to success are sponsored by RISE too. Donations can be made through St. David's website, or send a check directly to the church, with a notation for RISE OUTREACH.

During Covid, and post-pandemic, the need for the services RISE provides has greatly increased. A NJ TV News report in May said there are 800,000 food insecure people in NJ and 17% of children in South Jersey are hungry. In our own backyard in Hightstown, RISE gives out around 150 supermarket carts of fresh food every Wednesday evening. Before the pandemic, a Wednesday evening was considered busy if 20 supermarket bags of food were given out. The need is greater than ever and RISE, with our congregation's help in terms of \$\$ and volunteer time is working hard to meet this need. Please give generously."


