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# Death in Our Diocesan Family

The Reverend Geoffrey Collis

March 28, 1950 to October 2, 2020

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The Rev. Geoffrey Collis from Rumson, died in his sleep at his summer home in the Poconos on October 2, 2020.

Rev. Collis was ordained to the priesthood on December 18, 1976 by The Rt. Rev. Albert W. Van Duzer. In the Diocese of New Jersey, Rev.
