Masks are effective in situations where we are not able to physically distance, but it is important to remember that distancing is still the most effective way to avoid spread. Please maintain a 6” distancing whenever possible, but especially when removing masks.

Singing softly by members of the congregation is permitted. You may join in the prayers by speaking softly while wearing your mask.


