Priest: In this time of fear and stress, we turn our hearts to you, looking for your help and consolation.

As we leave behind the Season of Pentecost and approach Advent with joyful expectation, we cautiously maintain our isolation for our own safety, and out of concern for one another. We affirm that the power of God is greater than death. We take heart as we remember your love for all creation, and we recall the many times when the people of St. David's gathered to be fed by your word and sacrament.

We remember, too, that many times in ages past your people were fed through your loving care. We remember the food you provided your People as they journeyed through the wilderness toward the Promised land. We remember how, in another wilderness place, Jesus fed the multitudes who had come to listen to his preaching. And above all, we remember the evening when Jesus gathered with a small group of his friends, to link his life to the ancient story of liberation celebrated by the Jewish people in the Passover. He created a sacrament for your Church, but in this time of sickness, when our joyful celebrations are curtailed, we cannot gather as we would wish.

We have feasted on your word, and now we give thanks that in this time your love reaches into our homes so that having this food before us reminds us of the abundance of your goodness through which we are sustained every day.

With sorrow, we mourn the loss of receiving your blessed Body and Blood.

With gratitude, we take what you have made available to us as a taste of the abundant grace of your kingdom. We thank you, Lord, our God

All: We thank you, Lord our God.

Priest: As one family we now pray as our Savior Christ has taught us,

Announcements

Because of the recent rise in the infection rate of Covid-19 in the state of New Jersey, the Bishop has counseled churches of the Diocese to suspend in-person worship. For the time, St. David's will revert to the kind of online Zoom service that we had through the spring and summer. A special Advent service bulletin for our Zoom services will be found on the Events page of the website. You are encouraged to have an Advent Wreath at home, and join as families from the parish lead the candle lighting beginning next week. We have every reason to hope that major shut-down across the state will bring a decrease in the infection rate and allow us to resume in-person worship before Christmas.

When the church is once again open for worship, registration for the in-person service is primarily online, using the link found on the Events page of the parish website. It will cap attendance at 25 households. We will keep three future services up so that you can pre-register. Right now, it seems that the maximum number of registrants is not being met, so if you have already attended a service and you would want to attend the following week, you may do so.

Moving forward, registration for services will remain open and only close once the maximum capacity limitation of 25 is met.

The altar party (priest, deacon, lay reader, music director) must also register (remember to put your title next to your name.)

Advent Study and Compline

On December 3, 10 and 17 at 7:00 pm, Fr. Don will lead a study of major parables, with a video by Amy-Jill Levine. A professor of New Testament Studies at Vanderbilt University, Professor Levine brings a distinct Jewish understanding of parables as she helps to unfold how Jesus used them in his teachings.

On December 3, we will look at the parables of the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin and the Lost Son.

On December 10, we will study the parable of the Good Samaritan.

On December 17 the study will focus on the Laborers in the Vineyard.

Each of the videos is short (about 10 minutes). A conversation will follow. The evening will conclude with Compline.
