This quote from C.S. Lewis speaks quite powerfully of life here at St. David's. The past year has been filled with moments of incredible joy as we continue to grow in our faith together. The end of 2023 is a good place to sit and reflect on some of those times as we begin to plan for our upcoming year.

We have seen our children grow (literally). Our loving and talented Sunday School teachers build community and friendships with our youth of all ages. Deacon Carol's energetic Children's Talk on Sunday have let us learn as well. Our teens have connected in their J2A (Journey to Adulthood) gatherings and we now have eight of them prepared to make their commitment to being adults in our church while they continue their spiritual journeys amongst us.

We continue to welcome a variety of skilled preachers to join us at the services. A special thank you to Rev. Carol Patterson and Chaplain Kate O'Connor for sharing their voices from the pulpit. It has been truly a personal honor to work with these two women who have the most caring and pastoral hearts I've ever known. We've had members, new and old, join many of our ongoing ministries in the parish, from Vestry to Lectors, choir and ushers. ### **A Lenten Evening Book Discussion**

(Hosted by John and Deacon Carol Patterson)

You are cordially invited to our home for a Lenten discussion of the book <u>Who</u> <u>Moved the Stone</u>, written by Frank Morison, including a light supper (soup and crusty bread) with some time for social conversation.

Frank Morison writes that 'the purpose of this book was to take the last phase (seven days) of the life of Jesus, with all its quick and pulsating drama, its sharp, clear-cut background of antiquity, and its tremendous psychological and human interest – to strip it of its overgrowth of primitive beliefs and dogmatic suppositions, and to see this supremely great person as He really was."

We will meet for 5 consecutive Wednesday evenings beginning on Wednesday, February 21 through March 20. We will begin at 6:30 with a light supper and some social time to chat and catch up with one another before we begin our discussion at 7:00 – 8:15.

The book is available on Amazon for \$ 10.00. It is an easy read with 194 pages. We will cover the first 42 pages at our first gathering. Then as a group, we can decide how much to read each week.

A sign-up sheet will be available on the bulletin board. We will be able to host the gathering at our home for 2 – to 25 or however many want to participate! If you can't attend the discussion group, I urge you to read this book. I read it many years ago and it impacted my understanding and acceptance of why and what our Lord Jesus Christ went through during the last seven days.
