We are fully immersed in our season of stewardship, centering our contemplations around the theme "Be The Bridge." (Hats off to Brijette Aris and her committee for creating great spaces for us to have conversations around how we can use our talents and treasures to support all our ministries here at St. David's.) Part of our reality, however, is that our financial health has become more challenging as the overall economy is impacted. Last year, the vestry brainstormed to come up with some ideas of how we can effectively juggle our budget to meet these needs. And the realization that the best way for St. David's to continue to be a beacon to the world around us is to get everyone involved in our well being.

I have been focusing on one particular bridge – our past and our future, with the bridge being the here and now. We have an amazing legacy in this parish, from the initial gatherings at the Peddie School chapel to the building of our current space. Through the leadership of Father Fish and Mother Karin, who helped us to envision a future that is our reality today. Now we stand on the bridge, looking behind and ahead, and our leadership is looking for the best way forward.

As you consider the stewardship season this year, I ask you to include time for these questions:

Do I pledge? Many of us have grown up in denominations that do not have the same structure as the Episcopal Church, where the generosity of the parishioners is the main support of ministry and mission. So what does pledging mean to me? Do I understand how the commitment works and how it helps in planning the future?

Am I pledging all that I can give, or am I holding back? In a society where independence is honored, we can fall into the idea of taking care of ourselves and sharing only what is left over. If I'm offering less than I might be able, can I make a small increase to stretch in my commitment?

How can I give more of myself to the community from the abundance of my heart? We all have gifts that can be given freely to the church, but sometimes we hesitate to offer. There are so many activities currently going on that need time and volunteers. There are also lots of opportunities to create new ministries to fit the gifts of the congregation. How can I do more?

Finally, and most importantly, where is God calling me to be? Seeing ourselves as God's beautiful creation helps us to realize that what we have to offer is perfect and appreciated. Take some time to simply listen to where God is leading you, and what obstacles stand in the way of that path.

There are challenges that we as a community will take on and overcome, but only if we all pitch in to help. Over the next few months, our vestry will be bringing the parish up to date with those challenges and looking for creative ways for us to deal with them. Let us see how we can support our parish in the year ahead, so that St. David's will continue to care for our surrounding community and be a constant presence in the lives of all who gather in this sacred place in Cranbury.

A note from our Treasurer

Perhaps like yours, the Church's 2024 financial picture is quite challenging. Due to circumstances beyond our control, we have lost several significant pledging families. In addition, as you may know, we receive rental income from several outside groups. Unfortunately, in 2024 that steady source of income is decreasing.

If your home is more than 40 years old, you know that you must make significant repairs. That is exactly where we find ourselves. We need to have the roof of the main building replaced along with much of the carpet which was installed when the building was built. These repairs will be financed by an additional mortgage. This will increase our mortgage payment by about 20%. In addition, we expect more small repairs will need to be made. The utilities bills have continued to climb. Our projected utility expense for 2024 will be double what it was in 2021 and in general, all of our expenses continue to rise.

In recent years our pledge income has paid slightly more 70% of our expenses. The remaining 30% is made up of Building Use, Gifts, Fundraising and other small income sources. Therefore, it is essential that the increase in pledges keep up with our increasing expenses so that we can continue our mission and support our ministry in the community. In order to balance the budget our pledge levels need to increase from 2023 levels by about 12%. Through a combination of increased pledges and new pledges this target can be met.

Please prayerfully consider the pledge you can make.

November Outreach of the Month The Seamen's Church Institute



SCI is "deeply committed to mariner wellness and pastoral care, maritime training and education, and advocacy for the men and women in their essential...role in the transportation industry."

SCI was founded in 1834 and is affiliated with the Episcopal Church, but nondenominational in terms of their spiritual and practical services. Annually, their chaplains visit thousands of vessels, offering pastoral counseling, support and social welfare services. Their maritime education centers provide navigational training. The Center for Maritime Advocacy provides legal services free of charge and speaks out for mariners' rights. Their Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) program offers interactive workshops in suicide first aid to help recognize when someone contemplates suicide and how to work with them to support their immediate safety.

For years our St. David's knitting group has donated knitted hats, cowls, and slippers to the Christmas at Sea (CAS) program which delivers only hand-made knitted gifts to both international and US mariners at work aboard ships.

As a non-profit, SCI's work is only made possible through the support of their donors. Please give generously to help them to continue to tend to the spiritual and practical needs of mariners of all faiths in their working environment.


