When I started at my first call in ordained ministry, I was excited to work in a parish that had lots of tradition and a willingness to try new things. I was about 3 months in (collar still gleaming white) when we began to prepare for the annual Roast Beef Dinner. On the first Sunday in September we announced the signup sheet for tasks was in the narthex, and people should sign up right away. I knew we had a few new members, wanted them to be part of this major event, so I invited them to sign up.

After a couple of weeks of encouragement, I noticed one family name was missing. They had joined us from another church where they had been quite active. I spoke to them and they said they had been quite happy to work at it but could not find the sheets. "They're hanging in the narthex" I assured them. It was then that one of the parents smiled and said "That's what you said. But we have no idea what 'narthex' means." This was one of several reminders I received that while it might make perfect sense to a cradle Episcopalian, there are lots of things we say and do that are not automatically understood by new members. Also, there are ministries and activities we do regularly that to new participants seem impenetrable. "Like we always do" can be considered community jargon within our parish. Attention to this helps us become more welcoming to all those who step through our doors.

Stewardship is spoken of in some other religious communities but not in all. It is also something that we engage in and assume everyone has experience with how it works. As we approach this year's Stewardship program, I'd like to start unpacking (well that's a jargon word I don't like!) what it means to the parish of St. David's. The way that the Episcopal Church is set up financially, each tier supports the one above. The national church is supported by 10% donations from all the dioceses, who are supported by 10% from all the parishes, who is supported by 10% donations from all the parishioners. Of course, this has evolved over the centuries, but relying on the engagement of all parishioners allows ministry to continue in the parish. So we ask for everyone who attends St. David's to consider making a pledge for the 2024 year. Commitment can come from any or all of three areas: time, (giving a set amount of volunteering) talent, (sharing gifts that enhance worship) and treasure (a portion of income.) These contributions allow us to staff our church, offer beautiful worship, and keep the basics going, like heat and lighting.




